GLIMSES OF BHUTAN BIRD FESTIVAL - DAY 1



DONATIONS FROM PRO BHUTAN- GERMANY



Pro Bhutan, Germany Executive Chairman Herald N Nestroy handed over to Zhemgang CS geysers, drinking water dispensers, and 430 desks for boarding students sponsored by 300 children of an elementary school in Munch, Germany last week. Sonamthang CS received two generators and 18 air conditioners for classrooms. The equipment altogether costs nu 4.8 million.

DHANGKHAR MENCHU REVIVED

Dhangkhar Menchu (medicinal water) facility located at eight kilometers from Zhemgang on Trongsa-Zhemgang secondary highway was revived jointly by Dzongkhag administration, Zhemgang Forest Division and Dhangkhar Community Forest Management Group at the cost of Nu. 0.50 million.

The revived facility was inaugurated by His Excellency Prime Minister Dr. Lotay Tshering along the sidelines of Bhutan Bird Festival. In olden days, Menchu therapy was used to treat many illnesses when there were no modern medicines. Menchus are believed to be blessed with sacred healing effects by Buddhas and Bodhisattvas which not only cure diseases but also heals inner, outer and secret defilements. Besides, healing purposes, our people use Menchu for recreation and relaxation.

Dhangkhar Menchu is believed for healing diseases such as gastric, piles, body and joint aches, headache and skin diseases.

Community Development for Health

Health Assistants working in various health centers under Zhemgang Dzongkhag were trained about the CDH from 23rd to 30th of December 2019. The workshops were conducted successfully in four teams; two teams deployed in both Upper Kheng and Lower Kheng respectively. The health assistants were trained to further brief the general public in the remaining clusters of their jurisdiction and at the same time train the public of the selected clusters. A total of 19 HAs participated in the ToT and a total of 12 clusters were covered during the training. Clusters namely Buli under Nangkor Gewog, Lower Shingkhar and Lower Wamling under Shingkhar Gewog were covered by Group A. Nyakhar under Nangkor Gewog and Wadang and Gonphai under Bardo Gewog were covered by Group B. Bjoka under Bjoka Gewog and Lingmapong and Lamtang under Goshing Gewog were covered by Group C. Lastly, Kagtong, Lower Sonamthang and Marangduet under Ngangla Gewog were covered by Group D. The training covered about 500 households in the two regions. It was conducted with an aim to improve Sanitation and Hygiene in the rural areas of Zhemgang and was organized by the officials representing Public Health Engineering Division, Department of Public Health, Ministry of Health, Thimphu with financial and technical support from SNV, Thimphu. Pour flush toilet is the only toilet that is considered to be an improved toilet among those different kinds of toilets being used by the Bhutanese populace. The training stressed more on to constructing a pour flush toilet. The whole community is at risk when there's minimal sanitation and hygiene in the vicinity. Therefore, the target is to make the community aware about the sanitation and safe hygiene practices. The achievement of which is both a collective responsibility and benefit for all. Understanding of sanitation as a public health issue is essential for achieving progress. In recognition of the importance of sanitation and hygiene in reducing overall related disease burden, health sector is increasing its focus on giving access to improved sanitation and hygiene practices through the RSAHP. The new approach in the CDH used is subsidy free and is based on mobilizing community action through demand creation for sanitation. The Training of Trainers on CDH is the third stage of planned activities in the hallmark of Rural Sanitation and Hygiene Program.

Panbang Youth Cooperative (PYC) in Pursuit of Tomorrow's Agriculturist



Under the LGKRA 1 (Gainful employment created and local economy enhanced) Dzongkhag has targeted to establish 20 new CSIMs (farm) within the period of the 12 Five Year Plan. So far, the Dzongkhag has established seven farm enterprises:

1. Panbang Youth Cooperative
2. Layer farm in Berti
3. Layer farm in Kulamti
4. Piggery farm in Berti
5. Broiler farm
6. Livestock Farmers' Group in Panbang
7. Kikhar Women Vegetable Group.

Panbang Youth Cooperative (PYC) is one of the them who will be pursuing integrated horticulture dairy farming. The Co-operative was formed by 15 educated youths comprising of 10 males and 5 females.

PYC has three broad integrated agriculture dairy plans with essential services set-up in Panbang town. Under the Agriculture Sector, they are gearing towards producing winter chilli, tomato, pineapple, watermelon, nursery, ginger and turmeric. Under Livestock, they will be establishing commercial dairy, poultry, fishery and piggery farms. Other than the farm enterprises, PYC has already established saloon, cobbler and laundry services. PYC is also planning to set-up Photoshop and printing house in Panbang.

PYC is in pursuit of 'Tomorrow's Agriculturist'.

SAVE FOREST TO SAVE BIRDS

As saying, the chirping of birds is not for me, but for entire human kind. So birds are most beautiful animal on the earth. It flies with the change of colour and size that they have. Bird are warm-blooded egg-laying creatures. They have the abilities to attract the tourist and they are a special kind of animal species with species character.

In our Bhutan we have approximately 700 species of birds recorded. As we know many birds was extinct over many years. There are major threat that affect our birds, as we know many birds also nest in logged forest or even in degraded forest, though nesting are usually affected by human disturbances and thus unsuccessful.

It includes habitat loss and degradation due to shifting cultivation and logging. Cutting and burning of forest also pose a serious ecological impact on biodiversity as well as soil and water conservation which ultimately led to habitat loss and soil degradation. Cultivation like (tseree) cultivation will have impact on birds by reducing their habitat size and destroying their foods tree diversity. Clearing or conversion of land for cardamom will not only destroy the nesting and feeding tree species, but also create habitat fragmentation that would pose great threat in reduction of bird's population and other wildlife animals.

Also in the course of these constructions activities like building of roads and power of transmission corridors in the forest will probably led to bird's habitat and fragmentation and may be at risk of colliding with power line when in flight. Increase in illegal activities (hunting, logging) and other factors will contribute in reduction of bird's population in the areas. Heavy grazing have come under increasing pressure because many of the forested land are now being converted for cultivation and migrating to construct new houses, it clearly indicates that human is the main source of pressure on surrounding natural forest and also cause damage to native tree population that most birds depends on nesting and feeding.

As we know birds are a restricted species that required suitable forest for their survival and clearing these forest by the above activities would definitely threaten the bird's survival. So it is crucial for all of us to ensure long term protection and plant more trees, as a literate person we should give appropriate awareness program because birds are like a source of income in our country, which attracts the tourist for birding. After that our government gets incentive in the form of revenue, which helps to develop economically and convert that revenue to protect our birds in the future. As stated in slogans on saving Bird "It is not the man who dies out of thirst, birds too"
